

- Affording under-served communities access to international speakers and the broader Agile community


The pilot of the initiative was run in South Africa in October 2018

4, 5, 6 OCTOBER – KASI CREATE-A-THON




"**Kasi**" is South African slang for "township". A township is a typically underdeveloped urban area that, until the end of apartheid, was reserved for people of colour.

The **Tshwane University of Technology** (TUT) Faculty of Information and Communication Technology is based in the township of **Soshanguve**.

To close the gap between the Agile industry and the university students, TUT decided to host their first annual Kasi Create-A-Thon (KasiCAT). KasiCAT followed a hackathon format, underpinned by Agile practices. It was organised by the student community and academic staff, in collaboration with the local agile community.



Day 1 = Workshop Day | Day 2 = Product Creation | Day 3 = Showcase






